

Roadmap to Recovery: Phase 3 “A Safe Start”

On January 11th, 2021, Washington State transitioned from the previous “Safe Start” four-phase by county program, to the new “Healthy Washington Roadmap to Recovery” to direct the reopening of businesses and activities.

Rather than a county by county process, the State has been organized into regions where the region must meet certain requirements to be able to advance from existing restrictions. (Click [HERE](#) for further details.) We are classified as **Northwest** which includes Clallam, Jefferson, Kitsap, Mason Counties.



Currently, the Northwest area is in Phase 3. The guidelines for Phase three are:

Worship Services

Indoor maximum 50% capacity

Weddings and Funerals

Ceremonies and indoor receptions, wakes, or similar gatherings in conjunction with such ceremonies are permitted and must follow the appropriate venue requirements.

If food or drinks are served, the eating and drinking requirements apply.

(Currently, serving of food and drinks in the building is prohibited.)

Professional Services (including Support Networks/Groups)

Remote work strongly encouraged. 50% capacity otherwise.

The Board of Trustees, in alignment with the state's recommendations, will be proceeding with our "return home" on Easter Sunday.

The "Safe Seating" @ 50% Capacity in the Fellowship Hall will be set at 10-12 people and the Sanctuary Seating Capacity will be 24-32 pending the room set-up.

For each week's Sunday Celebration Service we will be requiring a reservation to attend the service in person. Please contact Robbin or Tim at Unity or leave a message at 360-457-3981 by the Friday prior to the service indicating you would like to attend.

THE SUNDAY CELEBRATION SERVICE WILL CONTINUE TO STREAM "LIVE" TO FACEBOOK.

When to return is your decision.

Those attending in person will have to adhere to "Safety Precautions" while in attendance including wearing a mask at all times. (Guidelines on page 8)

Our Revival

Let us celebrate Christ this month. Christ is my teacher. My life has been devoted to spiritual understanding. But I have had difficulty commanding the language and have relied on understanding through thoughtfulness, meditation, reflection, and wisdom. This week I am happy to receive some help from Rev. Gaylon McDowell, host of *Truth Transforms* on [Unity Online Radio](#)®.

Revival. Resurrection. Crucifixion. Ascension. Atonement. Historically, these are the words that represent Easter and its symbolic celebration of Jesus.

“Metaphysically, the resurrection is our power to overcome, to restore, to renew with health, peace, love, prosperity, and joy, whatever it is that we are trying to revive,” said Rev. McDowell.

“Jesus was the ultimate teacher who did miraculous things. He inspired people to see life differently. Jesus so considered and expressed God that the people could not think of God without thinking of him. They left their families to go follow this person. So, there was this outward movement of change that reflected a new way of being. The Kingdom of God was so manifested in his experience that lives were transformed, people were healed. His faith transcended the old ways of living and being.

The apostle Paul taught that in Christ there was no male or female, no Jew or Greek. Now that was radical. But as the people started to believe, they began to transcend race, religion, culture, language, gender, and class. In Christ, we are equal and that is the true beauty of Easter.”

The Easter message—living in an awareness of the Christ potential—we limit to just a few days. The transformational power that is inside all of us is cause for a lifetime of celebrations. Easter is not simply a play to be acted out; it is, in essence, an experience that can be lived every day.



Getting that Elusive Covid Shot by Alice Alexander

It appears that a lot of our neighbors in Clallam County have received at least one covid shot as the weekend clinic on March 13th and 14th only had about 500 attendees. When my husband and I got ours in Feb there were over 1600 for the two -day weekend. But if you haven't got your shot yet, there are still possibilities for you. As of today, the clinics will be vaccinating the next phase 1/B2 which include critical workers such as grocery store workers, food banks, agriculture, courts, corrections, jails, public transit, educators and licensed daycare workers. Also, 16 years or older who are pregnant or have disabilities that are at high risk for covid.

In addition, anyone who did not get one earlier is still eligible.

The Olympic Medical Center and the North Olympic Healthcare Network will be sponsoring clinics in the next few weeks. In order to register, you need to call, the number is 360-417-2430. The pharmacies, Safeway, Walmart, etc., are also giving vaccinations but you must register through the Clallam County Health Department's link which is vaccine.clallam.net/register.

In Sequim, Jamestown Health is also offering clinics but you must make appointments with Clallam County Health Department. Jamestown Health's number is 360-681-3447.

Clallam County has established a wait list that you can be on by calling 360-417-2430. If appointments open up you will be notified but you still must look for appointments yourself and then be sure and let Clallam County know if you have an appointment so they can take you off the list.

Watch the newspapers for coming clinics in April as they have not been determined as of this writing.

“A Safe Start” - NEW SERVICE GUIDELINES

Beginning with Easter Sunday, we will be entering the building in a whole new way, In order to reenter the property as outlined by the state’s “Safe Start” guidelines we have put into place a few guidelines that coincide with the state’s recommendations.

NEW RESERVATION PROGRAM

Due to the occupancy capacity we will be taking reservations in order to not exceed the recommended capacity of the building for phase 3. We will be able to accommodate 24 people in the sanctuary in addition to the sacred service team and the technical team.

Those wishing to participate in the "Live Service" each Sunday are to contact Robbin by 2:00 p.m. the Wednesday before the service to confirm availability and to guarantee seating. Arrangements may be made by calling 360-457-3981 or by emailing uito@olyphen.com. (PLEASE NOTE: Due to the recent increase in capacity and the re-entry being on Easter Sunday, for the Easter Service a ministry representative will be calling all members to inquire and collect reservations.)

The health safety precautions being taken are in addition to the following State Recommendations:

1. Groups/Individuals must be seated safely six feet apart.
2. Masks must be worn at all times. (even when singing)
3. Guests are reminded to sanitize often.



Please honor the HEART AGREEMENT and physical space of all and use *elbow bumping* instead of “HUGS / TOUCH”



This power of love resides in a place of great wisdom: our heart.




